Dear Parishioners and Friends

One of the dangers of the pandemic is that we can easily become obsessed with our own situation here in Ormskirk and Scarisbrick, in West Lancs, in the UK! Thank God, the situation appears to be improving, so it is fitting that over this weekend, when the Church celebrates the annual Day of Prayer for Eastern Christians, we remember and pray for our fellow Christians very many of whom are living in dire and dangerous situations, far worse that what we have experienced over the past year.

Cardinal Michael Fitzgerald M.Afr has written about our support for the Eastern Church and the following is taken from his letter:


I am very happy to announce to you that the annual Day of Prayer for Eastern Christians will take place on the Sixth Sunday of Easter (Sunday, 9 th May 2021), with the participation of Christians from all over Europe, the Middle East, North Africa, the Horn of Africa and India. This Day of Prayer will offer Eastern and Western Christians an opportunity to be united in prayer during the time of Easter. It will offer us in the West an opportunity to think of the Eastern Churches and to give thanks to God for all that we owe them: the first preaching of the Gospel, the origins of the monastic tradition, the early Church Fathers, and above all the witness of the Eastern Christians down the centuries, which has been, and still is, an inspiration to our faith.

This Day could also be an occasion to give thanks for the recent pilgrimage of Pope Francis to Iraq and to draw inspiration from its message of solidarity, fraternity and hope. Today, the Eastern Christians, many of whom are suffering from the effects of war and from discrimination, now face the added crisis of the Covid epidemic, with its threat to their livelihood, health and well-being. This is a crisis within an already existing crisis! They deserve our prayerful support.

In commending this Day of Prayer to you, may I suggest that you bring it to the attention of your family and friends, perhaps sharing with them the following prayer: *Heavenly Father, we pray today for peace in the world, especially in the Middle East. By your heavenly grace, strengthen the faith and hope of Eastern Christians. May they be blessed with peace and prosperity in their countries. May we be inspired by their devotion and witness to the Gospel, by their love and compassion for all in their communities, and by their courage, their endurance and self-sacrifice. Through their charity, tolerance and friendship, bring peace and reconciliation to those troubled lands, where Christianity was born and first spread. This we ask of you through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

I trust that this Day of Prayer, despite the restrictions caused by the current pandemic, will bring comfort and assurance to Eastern Christians. In our solidarity and communion, may we all be renewed by the hope we place in the Risen Christ. With the assurance of my prayers and with my warmest wishes for a joyful celebration of Easter.

CAFOD supporting COVID victims in India



Many parishioners have contributed their thoughts over the last couple of years, and we now have one last chance to reflect on the final recommendations that will be made by the Synod for inclusion in the Pastoral Plan drawn up by Archbishop Malcolm.

National Lockdown. Reminder of the Regulations. Attending Mass at St Anne's and St Elizabeth's.

Although we are still in a National Lockdown, it is a support to know that public Masses are being celebrated.

But please do not attend church if you are vulnerable or have been advised to shield.

Due to safety precautions **capacity at St Anne's Masses may be reduced.** Please take this into consideration when coming to Mass.

St Elizabeth's will continue to have a pre booking system. Please phone **01704 880451** to book a place.

Legally, all those attending church are required to abide by the following:

- face covering to be worn in church at all times and may not be taken off or moved away from the mouth or nose, except at the moment of receiving Communion.
- a face visor or shield may not be worn on their own but always with a mask or other face covering which fits securely round the side of the face
- name and contact details required for Track & Trace each time attending church it is a great help if you bring these written out ready to drop into the box in the entrance
- Or use the app on your phone to register on arrival, through the NHS QR.
- sanitise hands on arrival, then move through to the main church as quickly as possible
- ensure a safe distance when entering and leaving church and when going to receive Communion
- on exiting church, not stopping to mingle with anyone outside of your household/support bubble
- arrive in good time so that the stewards can guide you to a safe place without too much disturbance of other people.
- always follow the guidance of the stewards

Thank you for keeping to these legal requirements and so enabling the celebration of public Masses.

Jesus said that he loves us just as his Father God loves him. If we listen carefully to what Jesus teaches us we will know that love. Jesus' commandment to us is to love one another.


OVE ONE ANOTHER
