Dear Parishioners and Friends

There is an interesting episode in the Acts of the Apostles, 19:2, when 'St Paul went to Ephesus, where he found a number of disciples. When he asked, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" they answered, "No, we were never even told there was such a thing as the Holy Spirit."' It turned out that these 'disciples' had been baptised in the name of John the Baptist which was a baptism of repentance – as a kind of prelude to being baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. The twelve men were then baptised by Paul, they did receive the Holy Spirit and 'they began to speak with tongues and to prophesy'. This weekend we recall, on the feast of Pentecost, that first occasion when the followers of Jesus received the Holy Spirit. I think of God having been present to the apostles and early disciples during the lifetime of Jesus, through the physical presence of this man/God, Jesus. After the resurrection, God becomes present in a different way through His Spirit, in an even more personal way. Those disciples in Ephesus only realized what they had been missing out on once they had received the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is a good time for us to reflect on God's presence in our lives because we have been baptised! It is worth recalling a man who certainly did appreciate the divine presence in his life, St John of the Cross. The opening words of his mystical poem 'The Living Flame of Love' offer us an insight into the depths of being caught up into the life of the Trinity.

> O living flame of love that tenderly wounds my soul in its deepest centre!

The topic for discussion this week is Topic 4: Prayer and Spirituality

Synod Recommendation 10: Spiritual Formation

A. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include a provision to help parishes develop spiritual formation opportunities at the local and deanery level.

- B. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan encourage the process of developing "accompaniment parishes" in which family members would accompany one another to deepen faith, and where the parish would play its part in accompanying all who seek "life to the full" within the Catholic Church.
- C. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan warmly encourage all Catholics to grow in confidence in the grace of their baptism, taking the initiative to meet with others (using pandemic learning experiences) to share scripture, faith, and prayer.

Synod Recommendation 11: Sunday Liturgy & the Other Sacraments

A. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan acknowledge the primary place of the Sunday Liturgy in the life and mission of the Church.

- B. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan propose Liturgical formation for both laity and clergy so that the Sunday Liturgy is worthy and central in all we do in both the manner of its celebration and the mission it engenders.
- C. We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan provide a way for us to review how we are celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

National Lockdown. Reminder of the Regulations. Attending Mass at St Anne's and St Elizabeth's.

Although we are still in a National Lockdown, it is a support to know that public Masses are being celebrated.

But please do not attend church if you are vulnerable or have been advised to shield. Due to safety precautions capacity at St Anne's Masses may be reduced. Please take this into consideration when coming to Mass.

St Elizabeth's will continue to have a pre booking system. Please phone **01704 880451** to book a place.

Legally, all those attending church are required to abide by the following:

- face covering to be worn in church at all times and may not be taken off or moved away from the mouth or nose, except at the moment of receiving Communion.
- a face visor or shield may not be worn on their own but always with a mask or other face covering which fits securely round the side of the face
- name and contact details required for Track & Trace each time attending church it
 is a great help if you bring these written out ready to drop into the box in the
 entrance
- Or use the app on your phone to register on arrival, through the NHS QR.
- sanitise hands on arrival, then move through to the main church as quickly as possible
- ensure a safe distance when entering and leaving church and when going to receive Communion
- on exiting church, not stopping to mingle with anyone outside of your household/support bubble
- arrive in good time so that the stewards can guide you to a safe place without too much disturbance of other people.
- always follow the guidance of the stewards


Seasonal Vegetables

As we move into summer there are a wider range of locally grown fruit and veg. Here's a reminder of what is in season over the next couple of months.



Tips for reducing TV electricity consumption.

Whilst energy efficiency of LED and OLED TVs is better than plasma, they still make a significant contribution to electricity usage for families.



One thing to be aware of is the relationship between size and power consumption – the bigger the scree the more power.

Other useful tips are:

- Lower the backlight setting. The backlight is by far the biggest drain on your power, and the lower you can get your backlight, the less power your TV will consume. Placing your TV in a dark or dimly lit environment will help you avoid needing a bright backlight.
- Turn the TV off. It may sound basic, but some people leave their TVs running all the time. Leaving a TV on constantly will result in much higher costs than if you turn the TV off.
- A lot of TVs have a "Quick Start" feature. This usually means that they stay in a standby mode when you press the power button instead of shutting off completely. Turning these features off can help, but some models also allow you to hold the power button on the remote to shut down completely.
- Most TVs today feature a light sensor that can adjust the TV's brightness to the room. Instead of having the TV constantly run at a static brightness, this feature can help reduce consumption by lowering the brightness when it isn't needed.
- If you often fall asleep in front of the TV at night, make use of its sleep timer feature. This greatly reduces consumption since hours of playtime that would be used while you're sleeping will instead be kept in your pocket.


