***Dear Parishioners and Friends***

It has been quite an eventful week on all fronts! The country's main topic of concern has been about how England will fare in Sunday's final of the European Cup, while in our archdiocese great rejoicing at the appointment of Fr Tom Neylon as the new auxiliary bishop. Our congratulations and prayers go out to Fr Tom.

On the home front, Frs. Boniface, Hugh and I made a short visit to Douai for the completion of the annual meeting of the community (the Conventual Chapter). At the Chapter Abbot Geoffrey announced that from 01 September Fr Hugh will take over as parish priest of St Elizabeth's and that in October Fr Boniface will be returning to the monastery for a well-earned retirement, during which he will take on one or two jobs, including accompanying the monastic chant on the organ.

Becoming parish priest of St Elizabeth's after Fr Louis left 15 years ago has been a great joy for me. However, since Fr Hugh has been living in the presbytery for the past 3 years or so and has been celebrating Mass in St Elizabeth's when we have been unable to go there, it seems sensible that he should be fully involved in the parish. I know that he is delighted to be the parish priest. No doubt our two parishes will continue to work together on various projects so it is not as if we shall be living on different planets!

With the school holidays approaching it will be good to have the remainder of July and the month of August to take stock and begin to make tentative plans for the future. We have already put a few dates in the diary. On Saturday 04 September there will be a Memorial Mass in St Anne's at 1200 when we shall reflect on the difficulties and losses we all experienced because of covid.

We are planning over the weekend of 11/12 September to have a Welcome Weekend. On Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> at 1200 there will be a Mass to give thanks for the jubilee celebrations of Deacon Des, 25 years of diaconate service last year, myself with the golden jubilee of my ordination last year, together with other significant commemorations which you, our parishioners, may wish to recognize. On the 12<sup>th</sup> there will be a special Mass to welcome everyone back from the lockdown as we look to the future. Details of these and other events to be held in St Elizabeth's will follow in due course.

In the meantime, let us hope for victory on Sunday evening!

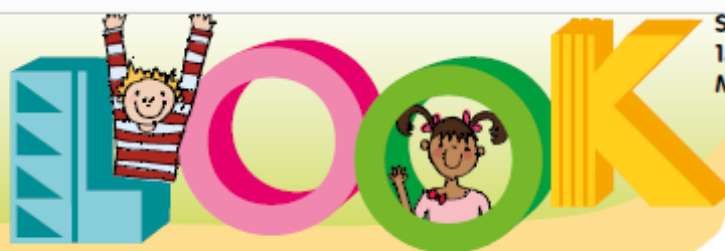
