When they were young Jewish children they would have never known that their grandson would be the Saviour or what great would be their lovely daughter, Mary. None of us knows that God may ask of us. We do our best, and He will enable us to do what He wishes. This day feasts for Grandparents': grandparents are of great importance. Let us cherish and pray for the grandparents in our parish.*

*29<sup>th</sup> SS Martha, Mary, Lazarus. They are the family at Bethany who gave a home for Jesus giving His love, food and time. This is a Feast for the gift of friendship. Truly Christians gifts are 'laughter and the love of friends'. Jesus blessed the love of their friendship and restore Lazarus from the dead.*
