Dear Parishioners and Friends

For our reflection this week I have taken a passage from the spiritual writer Henri Nouwen which appears in the current edition of 'The Tablet'. It echoes much of what I have been reading about recently with regard to 'how we can know God'. Rational 'arguments' can take us so far in our spiritual quest but ultimately it is God who takes the initiative to invite us into the life and dynamics of the Trinity. The head can begin the journey into the unknown, but it is in the heart that true disclosure takes place.

We cannot force God into a relationship. God comes to us on his own initiative, and no discipline, effort, or ascetic practice can make him come. All mystics stress with an impressive unanimity that prayer is "grace" – that is, a free gift from God, to which we can only respond with gratitude. But they hasten to add that this precious gift indeed is within our reach. In Jesus Christ, God has entered into our lives in the most intimate way, so that we could enter into his life through the Spirit.

SEASON OF CREATION

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November 2021. 'COP' means 'conference of parties'. Leaders from 197 countries, including Pope Francis, who have signed up to the UN's climate change treaty, will travel to Glasgow to take part in the conference. This will be the largest gathering of world leaders ever to take place on British soil.

The focus of the conference will be how to keep temperature rises below 1.5C. If the world warms more than this threshold, millions more people in the most vulnerable communities around the globe will suffer from devastating droughts, storms, floods and other impacts of climate change. Governments will be obliged to set out more ambitious goals for ending their contribution to climate change under the Paris Agreement (2015).

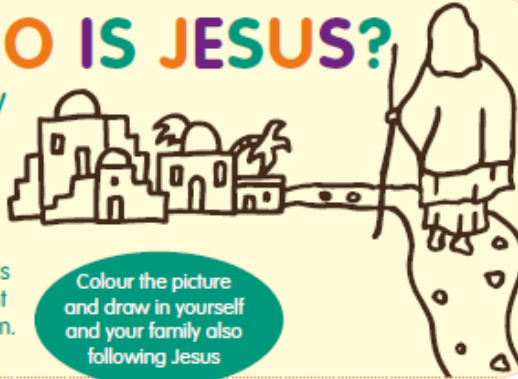

WHO IS JESUS?

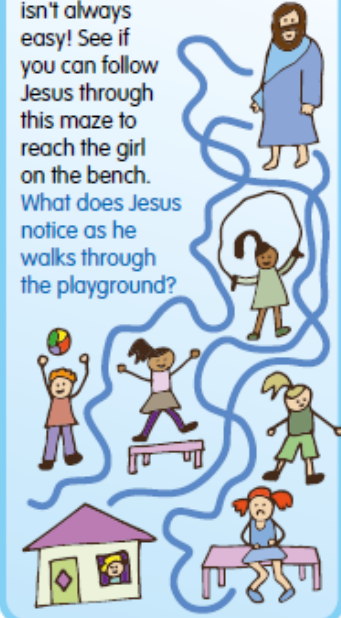
Follow God!

Following Jesus isn't always easy! See if you can follow Jesus through this maze to reach the girl on the bench. What does Jesus notice as he walks through the playground?

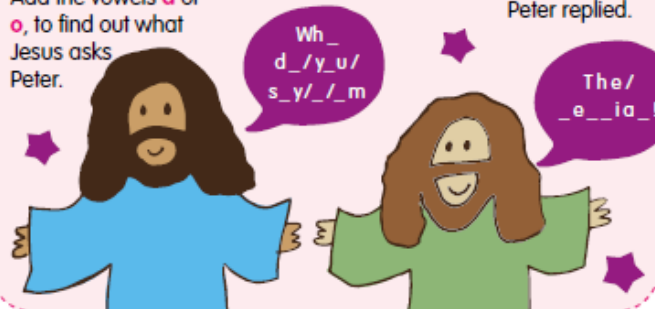
Maze



Who says what?

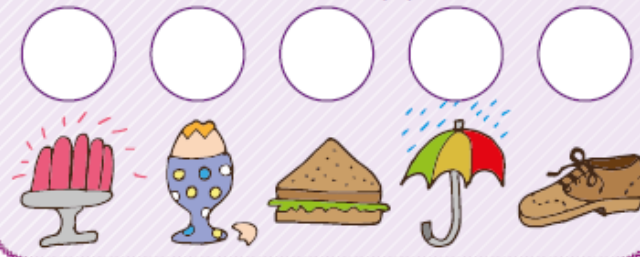

Date 12th Sep 2021 24th Sunday of the Year

Introduction: Together make the sign of the cross.

If Jesus was to ask you this question: 'Who do you think I am?' what would you say?



In today's story Jesus asks this question to his followers – read the story and see who gave the correct answer.



Gospel (Matthew 18:23-35) You may like to light a candle)

One day, while Jesus and his disciples were walking along, he asked them, 'Who do people say that I am?'

'Some say that you are John the Baptist, or Elijah or a prophet sent by God,' they answered.

Then Jesus asked them, 'Who do you think I am?'

It was Simon Peter who spoke up and said, 'You are Christ, the Son of God.'

After this Jesus began to tell them how he would suffer and die, but would rise again after three days. Simon Peter argued with him.

'Lord we must not go to Jerusalem. These things must never happen!' Jesus said to him. 'Peter, we must do things God's way, even though it will not be easy.'

Reflection

Some people had confused Jesus with John the Baptist in the story, and others thought he was a prophet and some people just thought he was simply the son of Mary and Joseph – People saw Jesus differently. It was only Simon Peter who recognised who Jesus was. He had grown to know and love Jesus and he had seen him perform miracles which were only possible through the power of God.

If we were asked the same question today, what would you say?

We know that he is Jesus the Saviour of the world and that he knows and loves each one of us.

Jesus shows us that it is important to follow God even if we know it won't always be easy. Think of a way this week that you can show you are following God!
