Choral evening prayer with the reception of the relic of St Oscar Romero – 6pm Thursday 14 October. Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP will preside in the presence of ecumenical leaders. The service will include stories from a recent visit to El Salvador by Fr Stephen Pritchard and information on the history of the relic by Jan Graffius, curator of relics at Stonyhurst College.

On Sunday 17 October, the Archdiocese of Liverpool will mark the opening of the local phase of the universal Synod 2021-23 with a choral evening prayer in the Metropolitan Cathedral from 3pm-4pm. This will also be an opportunity to pray for the forthcoming pastoral plan, the fruit of our own archdiocesan Synod 2020. It starts at 6pm in the Metropolitan Cathedral.

St. Anne's Scout Group

Every Sunday, we collect surplus food from Tesco at Kew, under the FareShare scheme.

This is a small part of the FareShare scheme and is not taking away from the foodbanks and other charities that get massive donations from the supermarkets each week. This food is at its 'sell by' date, but still perfectly useable. It would end up in the bin, if Groups, like ours were not able to collect it.

We distribute some of it to people who need it locally, and the rest is available on a Sunday afternoon, usually between 4.20 and 4.50 p.m. on the Pastoral Centre car park. During bad weather we open the Scout HQ and go inside.

Typically, we have bread, usually nice bakery bread, salad, vegetables and fruit. Every week is different, however every week we manage to keep about 14 or 15 boxes of food from entering landfill.

If anyone would like to be notified when we get a collection and what time we will be at the Parish Centre, please message Anne – 07803706389 and we will add you to our FareShare WhatsApp group. This doesn't commit you to coming each week, just when you want to.
