Dear Parishioners & Friends

This Sunday we hear again the wonderful Gospel story of Jesus meeting the disciples on the Lake of Galilee. Having had the good fortune to visit this area on many occasions I can well visualize the scene. Peter and the apostles have returned to their home area of Galilee. Their dreams of Jesus being the Messiah have been shattered; their only hope is to pick up the strands of life before Jesus called them; one can hear Peter making the half-hearted suggestion that they go fishing; and even then they don't catch anything. It is only when the mysterious man on the shore tells them to cast the fishing nets to starboard and they make the great haul of fish, that the apostles realize the 'stranger' is Jesus. Their sadness is transformed into great euphoria and their faith in Jesus restored forever.

If we have had moments of sadness, disbelief, anger at the way our world is developing or discouragement, maybe recalling the Easter events will help us find that Easter joy which so gripped the disciples after the resurrection of Jesus.

A couple of days ago I switched on the radio and caught the end of a programme. I'm now sure what the programme was about but the narrator then led into the prayer of St Ignatius Loyola which is not inappropriate for all of us at this time.

Lord, receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my whole will; all that I have and all that I possess. You gave it all to me, Lord; I give it all back to you. Do with it as you will, according to your good pleasure. Give me your love and your grace; for with this I have all that I need.

On Friday 22 April at the St Margaret Clitherow Centre, Canon Aidan Prescott led a moment of prayer for peace for Ukraine and a prayer of blessing for our eight drivers who are set to leave the archdiocese to deliver essential aid to the Polish border.

Fr Aidan also accepted a cheque from Mike as he has collaborated with people and organisations across Wigan to raise over £12,000 for the archdiocesan appeal.


A PRAYER TO SAY
