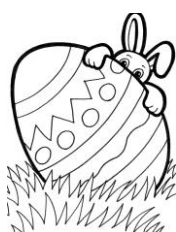

Legal restrictions relating to Covid safety have been removed by the government. However, the continued advice from both government sources and from church authorities is that, as the Covid virus is still with us, wearing face coverings reduces the risk of infection both to ourselves and to others.

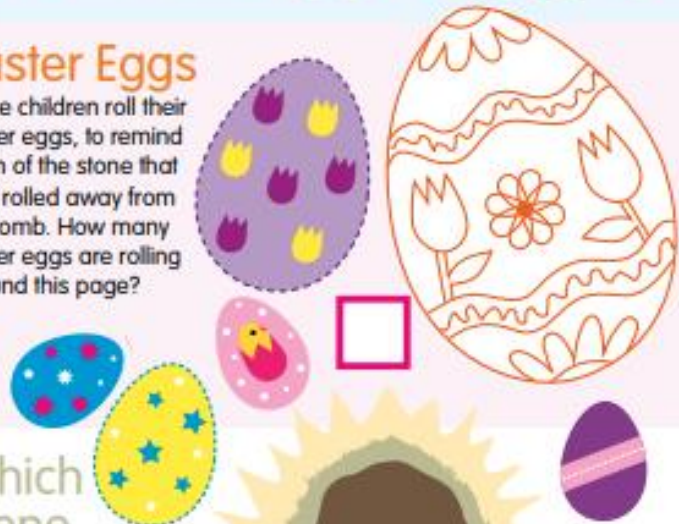
Alleluia!
