Dear Parishioners & Friends

A couple of days ago I was talking to a group of people about prayer. Someone passed a comment that we sometimes 'say' prayers but we ought to emphasize also, helping people 'to pray'. One way of doing this is to take a passage of Scripture, such as the one below, and use that as the basis of prayer. This way of praying is known as 'Lectio Divina', spiritual reading. Here is the Scripture reading (Mt 9:9-13) followed by a few suggestions as to how we can use it when we set aside a few minutes to place ourselves consciously in God's presence.

As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax office; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. And as he sat at table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and sat down with Jesus and his disciples. And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."

- Begin by talking to the Lord as though chatting to a friend. Share what's going on in my life, how I feel, what's good and the things with which I struggle. Then
- Read the Scripture passage slowly, and read it again.
- What words or phrases jump out at me? Why these particular words?
- Imagine that I was with Jesus on that occasion. How would I have reacted? What is Jesus saying to me here and now? How am I affected by this encounter with Jesus?

It is worth taking 5 or 10 minutes like this just opening ourselves to the Lord and allowing God to come to us. Who knows where He will lead us?
